Discussion of ongoing financial issues/concerns for Fall 2020 and FY 2021/22

Chair Magee began explaining that he believed the tax rate was not set at this time because town meeting was later than originally planned. He asked Spencer to update the committee on the current status of the town's finances. Spencer began by explaining that she was concerned a month ago because the previous town accountant was struggling. She explained to the committee that she is now working with the town of Eastham's finance director. He is helping set the tax rate and figure out finances. She explained they think at this time the tax rate will be set by the middle of November and the bills will go out. Chair Magee asked Spencer about a timeline before the town will run out of money, when can the town expect to see revenue coming back in. He expressed some concerns about the town's bond rating if the town defaults in anyway. HE asked what her expectations were regarding this. Chair Magee also asked why she is asking to borrow money internally rather than a short-term borrowing which she had asked about previously. Spencer explained to the committee that she is working with Rich and he suggested to borrow internally and that some taxes are already coming in as pre-pays. She stated the town received a nice bump from June through September rooms tax. She went on to explain that at this time the town has to prove to the state that they need the money to borrow and right now the town can't and she stated that's why she is going internally for the money and not externally. Discussion continued on money coming in from taxes and escrow accounts. They also discussed departments on where the money would be borrowed from and the concern for falling short with available funds. The committee discussed using an abundance of caution to make sure the town avoids any shortfalls. Spencer explained to the committee that if there was a need for short term borrowing, she would need three-weeks to get that processed and she is continuously checking the town's bank accounts and funds.
