

Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) at Cape Cod Tech

MSBA Phase I: Eligibility Period

- ➤ In January of 2015, after 4 Statements of Interest (SOI's) to the MSBA, Cape Cod Tech was accepted into the eligibility period in the MSBA's "CORE" program for a new school or a major reconstruction/renovation of the existing facility.
- ➤ The Cape Cod Regional Technical H.S. has formed a School Building Committee comprised of 25 members representing the interest of our 12 sending towns. Harry Terkanian and Tony Tullio represent Wellfleet on this committee.
- ➤ We reached agreement on a design enrollment of <u>650</u> students

Feasibility Phase & Schematic Design

MSBA Module II: Forming the team

Completed Items to date

- ➤ On September 30, 2015, the Cape Cod Regional Technical High School was invited into the Feasibility and Schematic Design Phase.
- ➤ On February 1, 2016, Strategic Building Solutions, DBA Colliers International was chosen as our Owners Project Manager (OPM).
- ➤ On May 17, 2016, Drummey, Rosane and Anderson (DRA) was selected as our designer.

MSBA Module III: Feasibility Study

Completed Items (continued)

- >On June 23, 2016, the Cape Cod Regional Technical High School committee chose to close our Welding/Metal Fabrication and Early Childhood Education programs.
- ➤ On July 11, 12 and 29, "Visioning Sessions" were held at our school with an educational consultant assigned to our project, Dr. Frank Locker. Thirty-five stakeholders from inside and outside the school participated.

MSBA Module III: Feasibility Study

Completed Items:

- ➤ In October 2016 we submitted with the assistance of our team:
 - Educational Program design
 - Initial Space Summary
 - Evaluation of existing conditions
 - Site development Requirements
- From October through December 2017, a preferred solution study will take place.



Feasibility Phase & Schematic Design

MSBA Module III: Feasibility Study

Items to be completed (continued):

- From October 2016 through December 2016, a preferred solution study will take place which will identify:
 - New school options
 - Several renovation/addition options
- ▶ By January 4, 2017, we need to select and submit our preferred option to the MSBA in consultation with our school building committee and our school committee.
- On February 15, 2017, the MSBA would approve our preferred solution.

Feasibility Phase & Schematic Design

MSBA Module IV: Schematic Design

Items to be completed (continued):

- From February through May 2017, the design process occurs.
- ➤ By early June 2017, specific, detailed cost estimates will be generated
- ➢ By August 2017, project scope and budget should be complete with warrants due to sending towns by August 24, 2017
- ➤On August 23, 2017, MSBA approves the Schematic Design



Feasibility Phase & Schematic Design

MSBA Module V: Funding the Project

Items to be completed (continued):

- From February/March through August 2017, communication with appropriate town committees explaining our preferred option with design and financial specifics.
- ➤ On October 24, 2017, a district-wide election will be held pursuant to Chapter 71 Section 16 (n).



What is Chapter 71 Section 16 (N)?

- Vote of the district committee authorizing the debt is approved by a majority of the registered voters in the member towns voting on the question at an election under the following provisions:
 - Warrant addressed to registered voters in member towns
 - Warrant signed by a majority of district committee
 - Sets forth date of election
 - Polling places

What is Chapter 71 Section 16 (N)?

- Hours polls to be open
- Question which is to appear on the ballot
- Must post warrant attested by secretary of the committee in public place in each town
- Must publish in one newspaper of general circulation at least ten days before election
- Number/location of polling places determined by district committee after consultation with selectmen or council

What is Chapter 71 Section 16 (N)?

- Hours must be uniform throughout the district
- Hours must be not less than 4 hours but no more than eight hours
- District committee responsible for preparation of ballots
- Town clerk of each town certifies the results to the district committee
- Expenses of election paid by regional school district as operating expense
- Defeat of proposal shall not prevent the resubmission of the same proposal as a new authorization

B.3.e. APPROVAL OF BUILDING/RENOVATION PROJECT AND DISTRICT WIDE ELECTION WARRANT – As recommended by the Superintendent-Director and the School Building Committee for the SWCRVSD,

A MOTION was made by Olaf Garcia that we vote to approve the language for the Building/Renovation Project and the Election Warrant as follows:

VOTED: That the Southern Worcester County Regional Vocational School District (the "District") hereby appropriates the amount of \$73,722,405 for the purpose of paying costs of designing, constructing, originally equipping and furnishing an addition to and renovation of the Bay Path Regional Vocational Technical High School, located at 57 Old Muggett Hill Road, Charlton, including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto (the "Project"), which school facility shall have an anticipated useful life as an educational facility for the instruction of school children of at least 50 years, and for which the District may be eligible for a school construction grant from the Massachusetts School Building Authority ("MSBA"), said amount to be expended at the direction of the School

Building Committee. To meet this appropriation the District is authorized to borrow said amount, under and pursuant to Chapter 71, Section 16(n) of the General Laws and the District Agreement, as amended, or pursuant to any other enabling authority. The District acknowledges that the MSBA's grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need as determined by the MSBA, and any Project costs the District incurs in excess of any grant approved by and received from the MSBA shall be the sole responsibility of the District; provided further that any grant that the District may receive from the MSBA shall not exceed the lesser of (1) sixty-seven and forty-one hundredths percent (67.41%) of eligible, approved Project costs, as determined by the MSBA, and (2) the total maximum grant amount determined by the MSBA, and that the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to this vote shall be reduced by any grant amount set forth in the Project Funding Agreement that may be executed between the District and the MSBA.

If the District were to receive an MSBA grant in the amount of 67.41% of eligible, approved Project costs, it is anticipated that the net principal amount of this debt allocable to each member town of the District, exclusive of interest, would be approximately as follows:

The debt authorized by this vote of the Committee shall be submitted to the registered voters of the District's member towns for approval at a District-wide election in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 71, Section 14D and Chapter 71, Section 16(n) of the General Laws. The date of such District-wide election shall be October 4, 2012, and the warrant calling such election, substantially in the form presented to this meeting, with such revisions as the Superintendent-Director shall deem necessary, is hereby approved. Seconded by: Robert Mowatt


TOWN ADMINISTRATION

The Town has been working through the Open Space Committee and with abutters to dispose of a portion of Town owned property located on Map 35-1 which contains a bulkhead.


This proposal is being brought before you under your Disposition of Town Owned Land policy. The area in and around Pleasant Point is experiencing serious issues of erosion which is starting to undermine a portion of the seawall that is owned by the Town. The abutters are interested in obtaining a portion of the land and the seawall from the Town. This proposal seeks your support to begin the process of disposing of a portion of the Town owned land which contains the seawall.


The abutters have obtained the technical services of Bob Perry from Cape Cod Engineering who will be doing the work to develop a site plan showing a section of the Town owned land being parceled off which contains the seawall that can then be disposed of. This is just the start of the process. Once a site plan is completed an appraisal will need to be conducted and a visit to the Planning Board and the other boards will need to occur as laid out in the policy. The final step will be action by the voters at the Annual Town Meeting in April, 2017.


The costs of the project are being paid for by the abutters. The Town will incur some legal costs as plans are reviewed to protect the town.





Policy on Disposition of Town-owned Land

Purpose

This policy was developed to encourage thorough consideration of requests for transfer of ownership or control of Town-owned land. This policy will attempt to ensure that the process for consideration of any request will take place in an organized, logical and transparent manner, and that all requests will be treated consistently and fairly.

General Procedure

The Board of Selectmen is responsible for all town-owned land that is not otherwise designated to the custody of another board, committee or department. Any town committee or board may petition the Board of Selectmen for recommendation of a specific parcel when they have a need or use for such land based on criteria which reflect the committee's or board's charge as authorized under the Town Charter or other applicable law. The Select Board will instruct the Town Administrator to review such application with all town boards, committees and departments so that they may be aware of such application and offer comments upon it. The Planning Board, because its charge overlaps other committees and boards, will provide its assessment after reviewing the inputs from other committees and boards. The Board of Selectmen shall take such comments into account in deciding whether to pursue the approval of the transfer by a Town Meeting vote.

Review Schedule

- Any request for disposition of Town-owned property shall be made in writing to the Board of Selectmen accompanied by appropriate maps, an explanation of the intended use and justification based on the committee's, board's or department's charge.
- Within fourteen (14) days of receiving any request, The Board of Selectmen shall
 charge the Town Administrator to notify all committees, boards, departments and
 other potentially interested parties.
- 3. Any Town committee, board, department or other interested group will evaluate an application based on the charge that the reviewing committee has been given under the Town Charter or other applicable law.

- 4. Within forty-five (45) days of the Town Administrator's notice, any party wishing to comment on the proposal shall do so in writing, and shall file said written comments with the Town Administrator. The Town Administrator shall forward all comments to the Planning Board and Board of Selectmen. All comments received shall be available for inspection by the public at the Town Administrator's office.
- 5. The Planning Board will review the application and all comments and shall report to the Board of Selectmen, by way of the Town Administrator, within a period of 30 days from the receipt of the information from the Town Administrator.
- 6. Within fourteen (14) days of the receipt of comments from the Planning Board, the Town Administrator shall review the comments and make a recommendation to the Board of Selectmen.
- 7. Within thirty (30) days, the Board of Selectmen shall review the proposal, the comments received, the Town Administrator's recommendation, and shall make a final decision to approve the request and whether to place the request on the Town Meeting Warrant or take any other appropriate action.

Recommended Timeline

The following timeline is recommended for any proposal requiring *Annual* Town Meeting approval. It is recommended that submissions for this review process should be made at least sixteen (16) weeks prior to any Special Town Meeting.

- 2. The Project underwent Joint Review between the Cape Cod Commission and the Massachusetts Environmental Policy Act (MEPA) Office during its MEPA review period, during which the Commission held hearings and provided comments on the project's MEPA filings;
- 3. The Secretary of the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs issued a Certificate on the Project's Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) July 15, 2016, determining that the Project adequately and properly complies with MEPA.
- 4. The Cape Cod Commission opened the Development of Regional Impact (DRI) public hearing period on the Project August 29, 2016;
- 5. Pursuant to Section 7(c)(vi) of the Enabling Regulations Governing Developments of Regional Impact: Chapter A of the Code of Cape Cod Commission Regulations (as amended Nov. 2014), the Applicant Towns of Wellfleet and Truro (Towns), and the Cape Cod Commission, hereby mutually agree to extend the DRI public hearing period on the above referenced matter to July 31, 2017, which extension will allow the Towns sufficient time to prepare and submit an application to the Cape Cod Commission, among other things, responsive to the Commission's comments provided during Joint Review.

Dear Governor Baker,

We, the members of the Wellfleet Board of Selectmen write to you to express our grave concerns about the degraded Pilgrim Nuclear Power Plant in Plymouth. We ask that in your role as chief safety officer of the Commonwealth you communicate with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) the importance of closing Pilgrim as soon as possible to protect the citizens of Cape Cod.

In 2015, the NRC downgraded Pilgrim's performance to one of the three worst nuclear power plants in the country, declaring it one step away from a shutdown. We are aware that Entergy will be decommissioning Pilgrim in 2019, but despite a lengthy list of violations and unplanned shut downs it continues to operate. Over the past several months our concern about a potential radiological disaster at the plant has risen as we regularly learn of its myriad malfunctions.

Citizens of Cape Cod seem especially vulnerable to a radiological plume from Pilgrim because there is no evacuation plan for us, instead, according to the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency, we would be told to shelter in place and await "relocation."

In our collective opinion, this is an unrealistic plan. Even the rumor of an accident at Pilgrim would send people to their cars in an attempt to get off the Cape rather than sheltering in place.

In fact, it is shocking to know, should there be an actual emergency, the only access to Cape Cod, the two bridges, would be closed and NO ONE would be able to leave Cape Cod by car. This is unacceptable. A true disaster plan that protects the health and life of people on Cape Cod needs to be developed.

In addition to the public health and safety threat that the degraded Pilgrim plant poses, there is the looming threat of a major economic disaster for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. On Cape Cod, tourism and real estate are the major economic engines. Both could be severely impacted for years, and house values would plummet should there be a radiological event at Pilgrim. Indeed Cape Cod towns could become uninhabitable and the economic losses would be incalculable.

In February of 2014, the Cape Cod National Seashore Advisory Commission released a study outlining the disastrous economic consequences of a radiological event at Pilgrim. (1) We have attached that paper for your review. Among its findings the report estimated that "a small-scale release of radioactive material at the plant could result in the loss of \$741 million to \$1.6 billion in tourist expenditures and \$23 million to \$63 million in state tax revenue over five years. A large scale disaster would likely increase the damage to \$2.2 to \$12.1 billion in tourist expenditure losses and cut overall economic output by \$45 to\$71 billion over 10 years". The study further predicts that the effects of a radiological accident at Pilgrim "could contract the gross domestic product by up to 1.5%, possibly resulting in a recession."

Recently we learned that the Massachusetts congressional delegation sent a letter to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) asking it to deny Entergy's request for an extension for critical safety

upgrades to the Pilgrim Nuclear Power Station. These safety upgrades were recommended by a panel of Energy's own engineers after the March 2011 disaster at Fukushima Daichi in Japan. Pilgrim is the same design as the reactors In Fukushima and subject to the same vulnerabilities. Signing the letter were Senators Edward J. Markey and Elizabeth Warren, and Reps. Michael E. Capuano, William R. Keating, Joseph P. Kennedy, III, Stephen F. Lynch, James P. McGovern, Seth Moulton, Richard Neal and Niki Tsongas.

To quote from their letter to NRC chairman Stephen Burns:

"Notwithstanding its intention to shut down the plant, Entergy has a paramount responsibility to minimize the risk of catastrophic accidents similar to the one that occurred at Fukushima, exempting Pilgrim from the NRC's safety requirements would allow Entergy to abdicate that responsibility, unjustifiably exposing Massachusetts communities to danger."

The facts show that neither Entergy nor the Nuclear Regulatory Commission have demonstrated appropriate concern for our citizens. We need your leadership in demanding that the Pilgrim nuclear reactor is shut down as soon as possible rather than allowed to operate in an unsafe manner. We also ask that a true disaster plan for Cape Cod is developed that puts the health and safety of the people first.

We thank you Governor for considering this serious matter and for communicating with us as to your results.



Enclosed is a contract and scope of services for the Town of Wellfleet that covers the transfer of FY 2017 Local Cultural Council funds from the Massachusetts Cultural Council to your local cultural council account for the Wellfleet Cultural Council.

State Comptroller regulations require State Agencies to have a signed contract and signature authorization form on file for all transfers of funds from state to local accounts unless the agency is statutorily released from this mandate, which the Massachusetts Cultural Council is not.

The contract includes: a signature page with the amount of the allocation (\$4,400), dates of service (July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017), and a place to sign. You only need to sign it, include an email address if possible and make any corrections if needed. The second page is the scope of services which defines how the funds are to be expended following Massachusetts Cultural Council regulations. The contract should be signed with a completed Signature Authorization form and returned to me by November 30, 2016.
