Recreational Permit Fee Schedule

Recreational Resident – \$60.00, Senior Resident – \$20.00, Seasonal Resident - \$40.00, Non Resident \$210.00, Seasonal Non Resident - \$85.00

It is the responsibility of all permit holders to acquaint themselves with the laws, regulations and amendments thereto governing the taking of shellfish. All permit holders are required to abide by Wellfleet's Shellfishing Policy and Regulations, posted on the left-hand side of the Shellfish Department's web page: <http://www.wellfleet-ma.gov/shellfish-department>. Some of Section 5 of the Town's Policy and Regulations for Noncommercial Shellfishing. *More info is in rest of regulations, which it is your responsibility to understand.*

5.1. Seasonal Restrictions: Open and Closed Areas

The opening and closing of noncommercial shellfishing areas, as well as catch limits, may be subject to change by vote of the Board of Selectmen. (See Section 5.3.2 Noncommercial Catch Limits). Notification of such changes will be available on the Shellfish Department section of the Town website and on the Shellfish Department answering machine.

Chipman's Cove: closes for the taking of all shellfish on April 30 and reopens on the last Sunday in October, unless otherwise regulated.

Area 2 (Indian Neck): open for the harvesting of shellfish, with the following limits and on the following days, unless otherwise regulated:

- June 1 through September 30; will be open Sundays and Wednesdays, annually.
- October 1 through May 31; will be open seven (7) days a week, annually.

Area 3 (The rest of the Harbor with the exception of commercial-only areas): Open for the harvesting of shellfish on the following days, unless otherwise regulated:

- June 1-September 30; will be closed to all noncommercial shellfishing, annually.
- October 1-May 31; will be open seven (7) days a week, annually. (See Section 4.1.)

5.3.2 Cannot Harvest for Commerce

No person holding a noncommercial permit shall harvest shellfish, eels or sea worms for the purpose of sale, trade or other consideration.

5.3.3 Noncommercial Catch Limits

The total amount of shellfish, comprising oysters, quahogs, soft-shell clams or razor clams, blood ark clam or ponderous ark clam taken in one (1) week shall not exceed ten (10) quarts, and the total amount of mussels taken in one (1) week shall not exceed ten (10) quarts, or the total amount of scallops taken in one (1) week shall not exceed one (1) bushel, or the total amount of surf (sea) clams taken in any one (1) week shall not exceed one (1) bushel. The total number of sea worms taken in one (1) day shall not exceed twenty-four (24). There is a 20 lb. limit on the number of eels that can be taken in one day.

Resident - A declared resident of the Town of Wellfleet. Written proof that Wellfleet is a legal residence of the applicant shall be required to the satisfaction of the Shellfish Constable and Board of Selectmen. Proof of legal residence may include voter registration, automobile registration, driver's license, income tax filings, census data, tax records or passport.
