Covid-19 Update

• Lemos gave some information on vaccines on the cape and the lack of them coming to the lower cape. She stated Wellfleet has 4 active covid cases and most residents over 75 have been vaccinated. She stated that she is advocating to her officials to get more vaccines down to Wellfleet and will continue to do so. They are vaccinating the town's homebound residents beginning in the next week. The Board discussed the need for vaccines in Wellfleet and how many residents over the age of 75 have not had their vaccines. Lemos stated she has called all the residents from the clerk's office census forms. The board discussed that at the previous night's Selectboard meeting it was stated that there are lots of people over 75 who had not been vaccinated. Drohan would like the fact that the health agent has gone above and beyond getting in touch with each resident by calling to check on vaccines being given.

Norton stated he has spoken to everyone that would make this decision and he feels this is a good time to reinstitute the bags.
