For Evacuations Use Police Vehicle Loudspeakers:

Officers to broadcast that evacuation is recommended due to hurricane (or other public safety emergency) as well as tell people where shelter(s) are located (generally it will be at the Elementary School).

Have DPW put up signs on Route 6 and elsewhere pointing out location of shelter(s) and water (potable as well as for waste disposal).

Senior Center for Elderly/Special Needs Persons:

Reassurance Program participants to be telephoned/visited as required.

Promulgation of Emergency Rules:

Closing of Roads to Vehicle Traffic;

If hurricane; leave beaches open (otherwise cars block roads).

Transportation of elderly/special needs cases as required.

Use Town employees, if available, to operate civil defense emergency telephones.

Shelter Concerns:

See if Eastham is opening their regional shelter. If not;

Notify Elementary school authorities (principal and custodian)

Town of Wellfleet Shelter Recommendations

The Wellfleet shelter is located at the Wellfleet Elementary School gym, situated on Lawrence Road (between the School Street traffic light on Route 6 and Long Pond Road). There is ample parking in the area.

The following items should be brought to the shelter with you:

- ✓ Bring a box lunch for your first meal. It will take awhile for food service to be set up.
- ✓ Food, if a special diet is needed
- ✓ Prescription drugs if needed
- ✓ Clothing for 24 hours
- ✓ Bedding and pillows
- ✓ Eyeglasses, reading material or other games of a quiet nature
- ✓ Supplies for infants as required
- ✓ Identification for you and your children
- ✓ Red Cross workers will assist you once you are at the shelter. The above items will help make your stay more comfortable.

Pets: Call the Wellfleet police department at 349-3702 for instructions. No pets are permitted in the shelter.
