
To Wellfleet Selectmen/women:

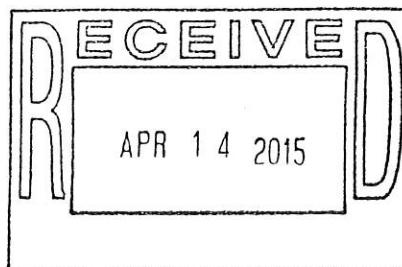


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Hatche's Creek, and south of the Lieutenant's Island Bridge.

Wellfleet Harbor (CCB 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14): All marine waters and intertidal areas enclosed north of the Eastham/Wellfleet Town Line, and east of a boundary from the Eastham / Wellfleet boundary on Billingsgate Island to the southern tip of Jeremy Point.

West Side (within CCB 11): The portion of the west side of Wellfleet Harbor immediately southeast of the no quahog dredge line (see below), offshore from the area commonly known as Middle Meadow.

No-drag Line:

1: Line extending from the navigational beacon (#14) at the seaward end of Indian Neck breakwater to a point on the tip of Great Island, marked with a striped (candy cane) pole.

2: Line extending from the striped pole on Field Point to the boathouse on Lieutenant Island.

No-quahog-dredge Line: Line extending from a point in Middle Meadow marked with a striped pole, towards the US Geodetic and Coast Survey marker at the landward end of the third groin west of Mayo Beach, ending where this line meets the No-drag Line (near the rocks known as Old Saw).

4.3. Landing of Shellfish

~~All shellfish harvested in Wellfleet shall be landed in Wellfleet. Oysters harvested from any approved site in Wellfleet may only be transferred to up to six (6) wholesale seafood trucks in the Wellfleet Marina parking lot at 255 Commercial Street provided that the following conditions are met:~~

- ~~1. Each transfer of oysters shall occur at the approved site so that unannounced inspections may be conducted by the Wellfleet Shellfish Department or State shellfish authorities;~~
- ~~2. Each wholesale seafood dealer truck shall have a valid permit issued by DMF; and~~
- ~~3. Each transfer of oysters shall be conducted in accordance with:~~
 - ~~a) DPH Regulation 105 CMR 533.000, *Fish and Fishery Products*, (See ~~105 CMR 533.000 Mass.Gov.~~)~~
 - ~~b) The Massachusetts 2014 *Vibrio parahaemolyticus* (VP) Control Plan (See ~~322 CMR 16.00: Shellfish Harvest and Handling Mass.Gov.~~), and~~
 - ~~c) The NSSP Guide for the Control of Molluscan Shellfish, 2011 Revision. (See ~~(NSSP) Guide for the Control of Molluscan Shellfish: 2011~~)~~

~~This variance shall expire on October 19, 2014.~~

4.3.1. All shellfish harvested in Wellfleet shall be landed in Wellfleet.

4.3.2 During the time that the Vibrio Control Season is in effect for that season, the Wellfleet Marina parking lot at 255 Commercial Street shall be used as the only location for commercial fishermen to transfer oysters harvested from any approved site in Wellfleet to a wholesale dealer's vehicle so that unannounced inspections may be conducted by the Town's Shellfish Department or State Shellfish Authorities.

The following conditions must be met:

- 1) Each wholesale dealer's vehicle shall have a valid permit issued by the DMF;
- 2) Each transfer of oysters shall be conducted in accordance with:
 - a) The DMF's Vibrio Control Plan and Regulations in effect for that season;
 - b) The National Shellfish Sanitation Program's Guide for the Control of Molluscan Shellfish in effect for that season; and
 - c) The Department of Public Health's Regulation for Fish and Fishery Products in effect for that season.

This regulation has been approved as a variance to 105 CMR 533.000 (I) (3)(f)(2) by the Director of the MDPH/BEH Food Protection Program and shall expire after a period of three (3) years. It shall

be in effect during the range of dates identified in the DMF's Vibrio Control Plan and Regulations for the years 2015, 2016, and 2017. At any time during this three-year period this variance may be revoked, modified, or suspended by the Department of Public Health if the conditions that are referenced above are not met. In accordance with 105 CMR 533.030(C), a copy of this variance will be available to the public.

Documents referenced in Section 2 a) are available on the Food Protection Program website during each Vibrio Control Season. (Go to www.mass.gov/dph/fpp.)

4.4. Daily Limit

No permit holder shall take shellfish or other marine organisms in excess of the daily limit. Noncommercial limits (Section 5.3.2); commercial limits (Section 6.3).

4.5. No Same Day Landings in Excess of Daily Limit

No person shall come ashore with shellfish and return to the waters of the Town on the same day for the purpose of taking additional shellfish in excess of the daily permit limit.

4.6. Landing Shellfish Before Shucking

No shellfish shall be brought ashore except in their shells with the exception of sea scallops.

4.7. Daily Time Limits

No person shall harvest, pick, dig, pile, take or carry away any shellfish from the waters of the Town, by any method between one half (1/2) hour after sunset and one half (1/2) hour before sunrise. ([MGL Chapter 130; Section 68](#))

4.8. No Shellfishing Below 28 Degrees Fahrenheit

Except in areas licensed for aquaculture, no shellfishing shall be carried on when the air temperature is below 28 degrees Fahrenheit (2 degrees Celsius), as determined by the Shellfish Constable and as indicated by a buoy displayed on the flagpole next to the Shellfish Office, on the Shellfish Department answering machine and on the Town website.

4.9. Poaching

Any unauthorized person who poaches or otherwise disturbs any shellfish in any amount or in any location shall be subject to criminal penalties and potential civil penalties (See MGL Chapter 130; and Section 11. 6 [Revocation of Shellfishing Permits](#).)

4.10. Disturbance of Grant by Other Than Licensee

No one may in any way disturb the growth or arrangement of shellfish on a licensed area, or work a dredge, or use any other implements to harvest shellfish, or discharge any substance which may directly injure the shellfish upon a licensed area, or willfully damage, remove or tie up to any of a grant's designating boundary markers, without the express consent of the licensee. No one, while upon or sailing over any such licensed acreage may have overboard any implement for the taking of shellfish, under any pretense or purpose whatever, without the expressed consent of the licensee. (See MGL Chapter 130; [Section 66](#) and [Section 67](#))

4.11. License and/or Permit Required

All persons fourteen (14) years old or older engaged in taking, removing, or having in possession eels, sea worms or shellfish, including soft-shelled clams, quahogs, surf clams, sea clams, razor clams, oysters, mussels, and scallops, taken from the waters of the Town shall have an appropriate license or permit obtained and used only in accordance with all terms, conditions and restrictions.

4.12. Inspection on Demand

All persons harvesting, carrying away or otherwise having in their possession shellfish or marine organisms of any

6.1.4. Hardship Exemption

The Board of Selectmen may at its discretion grant permits after ~~April 30th~~ **January 31st** if the applicant demonstrates **all three** of the following conditions:

- that unusual circumstances existed which would reasonably excuse a failure to file an application prior to ~~May 1st~~ **February 1st**, and
- that a substantial hardship would be caused by the refusal of a permit, and
- that the granting of the late permit would not affect the opportunity of applicants, who have applied in a timely manner, to harvest a reasonable quantity of shellfish?

6. 2. Commercial Shellfish Regulations

6.2.1 Required Icing and Shading of Product

Annually, during the period of time that the DMF's *Vibrio* control plan is in effect, harvesters must comply with the State's regulations. (See 322 CMR 16.00 Shellfish Harvest and Handling.) With the first offense of this section, the harvester will lose his or her product. With any subsequent offense, the harvester shall lose his or her product and license and/or permit for one year.

6.2.2. Harvest Must Be Tagged

At the time of harvest, any commercial permit holder who has shellfish of any kind for sale, trade or other consideration, must legibly mark all containers of shellfish using legal tags.

6.2.3. Minors Under Fourteen (14) Without Permit

Persons under fourteen (14) are permitted to harvest shellfish in a commercial area while under the supervision of a parent or guardian holding a commercial permit. No shellfish may be taken in excess of the daily limit of the permit held by the parent or guardian.

6.2.4. Commercial Catch Limits

6.2.4.1. Bay Scallops

No vessel shall take more than ten (10) bushels (tied) of scallops, including shells. No more than twenty (20) bushels (tied), shells included, shall be taken by any vessel having two (2) or more permit holders on board, in one (1) day. The captain of said vessel shall be cited for each violation.

6.2.4.2. Mussels

There is no limit to the taking of mussels per commercial permit per day.

6.2.4.3. Oysters

a. Hand Picking: no commercial permit holder shall take more than five (5) bushels of oysters, including shells, per day.

b. Dragging / Dredging: No more than five (5) bushels of oysters including shells, per commercial

6.4.6. Blackfish Creek:

Blackfish Creek will be open year round for the taking of quahogs, soft-shelled clams and oysters.

6.4.7 South Lieutenant Island

South Lieutenant Island will be closed for the taking of shellfish from June 1st through September 30th.

6.5. Use of Motorized Vehicles for Shellfishing

6.5.1. Motorized Vehicles on Beaches

Only commercial permit holders or aquaculture licensees may use motorized vehicles on beaches or in intertidal areas. (See Town of Wellfleet General Bylaws under ARTICLE VII GENERAL - [Section 24. Beach Vehicular Traffic By-Law.](#))

6.5.2. Terms and Conditions for Use of Motorized Vehicles

All use of vehicles to access areas licensed for aquaculture or other areas open to commercial permit holders, shall also be in accordance with the applicable general bylaws of the Town, and conditions, which may be imposed by the Conservation Commission.

6.5.3. Speed Limit on Beaches and Intertidal Areas

No person engaged in commercial shellfishing or aquaculture shall operate a motorized vehicle at a speed in excess of fifteen (15) miles per hour or a motorized vehicle which is dual wheeled or which has a gross vehicle weight (GVW) greater the nine thousand two hundred pounds (9200 lbs) on any tidal beach or flat or other land below the mean-high water line.

6.5.4. Allowed Line of Access for Vehicles

Persons engaged in commercial shellfishing or aquaculture operating motorized vehicles on any tidal beach or flat or other land below the mean-high water line shall drive only on the foreshore of the tidal area below the high tide line but above the tidal flat, closely rounding every groin or other obstruction extending below the high water line, to a point opposite a licensed area, and thence to the licensed area. The traffic not directed to a licensed area shall be confined to the area below the high tide line above the tidal flat, closely rounding any groin or other obstruction extending below the high water line. Parking is permitted on the licensed area or in the access route to a licensed or legal harvesting area as described above.

6.6 Transfer of Oysters to Wholesale Dealer's Trucks During Vibrio Control Season

Section 7. Shellfish Aquaculture

7.1. Issuance of Shellfish Aquaculture Licenses (Grants) for Areas Surveyed and Subdivided by the Town.

Once areas are identified by the Shellfish Constable as potentially suitable for the location of shellfish aquaculture, and the areas are under the control of the Town, the Board of Selectmen may exercise their discretion as the licensing authority for the issuance of license/s for shellfish aquaculture (grants) in compliance with [MGL Chapter 130](#). The Board of Selectmen shall post notice of the availability and location of such acreage, as well as any applicable conditions and/or limitations upon such acreage, on the Shellfish Department's notice board, at Town Hall and on the [Town Website](#).

7.2. Previously Established Grants that Become Available

In the event that a licensed aquaculture area previously certified by the DMF becomes available, its status shall be posted by the Shellfish Constable (see Section 3; [Informing the Public of Meetings Concerning the Fishery](#)) for a period of 30 calendar days. If more than one qualified person (as described in Section 1 under **Domiciled Resident**,

7.15.1. Required State Seed Permit

No person shall harvest, plant, transplant, transport, sell or otherwise have in their possession seed shellfish, without first obtaining a state seed permit from the Massachusetts DMF, as required by [MGL Chapter 130, Section 80](#) and [CMR 322, Section 15.04\(b\) 1](#)

7.15.2. Special Circumstances for Taking of Seed

From time to time, with the approval of the DMF and the Board of Selectmen, the Shellfish Department may open up an area for the taking of oyster seed only by aquaculture licensees who hold a seed permit.

7.15.3. Use of Spat Collecting Devices

The use of spat collecting devices such as Chinese hats to catch oyster larvae in areas not licensed for aquaculture, may only be done by commercial permit holders who also hold a seed permit (Section 1, **Definitions**). This may only take place during the spawning season, as determined by the DMF. This is usually from June 15th to September 15th.

During this period, catching oyster larva with such devices is legally considered to be fishing, not farming and the devices are classified as fishing equipment, not growing devices.

From time to time, upon receiving a recommendation from the Constable, the Board of Selectmen may vote to limit the areas in which such fishing is allowed or the numbers of Chinese hats or such other devices that may be set out by individuals in these same areas.

7.15.4. Catch Limit for Seed Specified on Permit

No license holder in any one calendar year may take, or cause to be taken, more than twenty-five (25) bushels of seed oysters per acre of licensed area or fraction thereof, pro rated at that rate.

7.15.4. No Seed Harvested by Dragging

No person shall harvest shellfish seed by dragging, except by the licensee within the boundaries of his or her licensed area.

7.16. Petite Oysters and Gems

An aquaculture license holder may harvest and sell petite oysters (between 2.5 and 3 inches in height) and/or gems (quahogs between ¾ and 1 inch in width) if:

- a. they do not have a Town of Wellfleet commercial shellfish permit;
- b. they have documented proof of purchase of seed
- c. they have the required amendment to their propagation permit, granted by the State, allowing them to sell petite oysters and/or gems to a previously designated dealer, approved by the State;
- d. they, or their employees, or otherwise affiliated persons (as defined in Section 7.8.4) Employees of Licensees or their families do not store any oysters or quahogs, harvested from the wild on their licensed area(s);
- e. they are limited to selling petite oysters and/or gems for a term of not less than a year, beginning with the routine issuance of an annual propagation permit from the State;
- f. they forfeit any claim to a hardship waiver under Section 6.1.4 Hardship Exemption of the Town of Wellfleet Shellfishing Policy and Regulations.

7.16.1 See Section 4.3.2

7.17. Predator Control

7.17.1. No Lethal Predator Control Measures

Unless specifically authorized by the Director, in consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and/or the National Marine Fisheries Service, it shall be unlawful to use lethal means to control or exclude predators or other organisms from any area used for aquaculture. Non-lethal enclosures, including, but not limited to, nets, fences, bubble curtains and noise may be used, if approved for a specific site and purpose. Invertebrate predators, pests and fouling organisms may be removed manually from an aquaculture site and disposed of in a lawful manner

7.17.2. No Taking of Horseshoe Crabs or Whelks/Conks Without Permit.

Being in possession of horseshoe crabs and whelks (conchs) for any reason requires a State permit. In this regulation, whelk/conch refers to either knobbed whelk (*Busycon carica*) or channeled (smooth) whelk (*Busycotypus canaliculatus*). (See [CMR 322 6. 34: Horseshoe Crab Management](#) and [322 CMR Section 6.21: Minimum Size for Conch.](#)) As stated in 7.17.1, neither species shall be intentionally killed while practicing predator control.

7.17.3. No Harm to Endangered Species

No person shall maintain a predator control method that will intentionally threaten any endangered species.

7.18. Aquaculture Gear and Equipment

7.18.1. Grants Shall Be Marked

Every licensee shall mark the corners of the area licensed under their license with buoys marked with the license number. From April 1st to November 1st, the corners shall be marked with fluorescent yellow balls, at least twenty (20) inches in circumference. Buoys shall be attached to their anchor by cables, chains or non-floating lines. Numbers shall be marked on said buoys, and shall be at least two (2) inches high and shall be black in color. Temporary buoys shall be required from November 1 through April 1.

7.18.2. Height of Equipment

No licensee shall place equipment or gear within the boundaries of the licensed area that rises more than eighteen (18) inches above the grade. Spat collection devices (such as Chinese hats) are excluded.

7.18.3. Marking of Gear

Every licensee shall clearly and permanently mark any and all trays, boxes, holding cars and all other aquaculture gear with the license number of the license area in a manner that is clearly visible.

7.18.4. Gear Must be Secured

~~All gear on licensed areas must be securely fastened to the bottom or removed. All unusable gear, including loose nets, twisted and damaged racks, loose envelopes, grow out bags and fastening devices must be removed from a licensed area and either disposed of properly or moved to an appropriate site, not located within a protected resource area.~~ **All equipment or gear on a licensed area must be securely fastened to the bottom at ground level or removed by January 15 or before ice prevents removal, whichever comes first. All equipment or gear which is no longer used as it was originally designed or intended to be used must be removed from a licensed area and either disposed of properly or moved to an appropriate site not located within a protected resource area. This includes loose nets, twisted and damaged racks, loose envelopes, grow-out bags and fastening devices.**

7.18.5. Exception for Ice in Harbor

The Shellfish Constable shall have the authority to temporarily waive these regulations if the presence of ice hampers the ability of a licensee to immediately comply with these regulations.

7.18.6. Fines for Gear Violations.

After receiving a written warning, the licensee has 7 days to comply. After the seventh day, a fifty dollar ticket shall be issued for each day of noncompliance. After 30 days of non-compliance, the licensee shall have his or her license revoked.

7.19. Buffer Zones

There shall be a buffer zone contiguous with the perimeter of any licensed area that is either twenty-five (25) feet wide, or one half the distance to the adjacent licensed area if less than fifty (50) feet, except where two (2) licensed

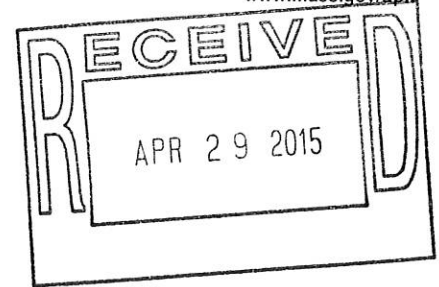

Dear Mr. Terkanian:

This letter is in response to an email dated March 18, 2015 from Helen Miranda Wilson which requests authorization to allow oysters which are harvested elsewhere to be transferred to operators of wholesale seafood trucks parked at the above referenced location, instead of at the harvester's landing site as required by 105 CMR 533.007(I)(3)(f)(2). A similar request was submitted in 2014 and was approved after being reviewed by the Director of the Food Protection Program (FPP) of the Bureau of Environmental Health of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health in accordance with 105 CMR 533.030(B).

FPP reviewed the 2015 request for compliance with 105 CMR 533.000, Fish and Fishery Products, and found that in this particular case, the strict enforcement of 105 CMR 533.007 (I)(3)(f)(2) would do manifest injustice. Therefore, under the authority of 105 CMR 533.030(A), the following variance hereby is granted for a period of three (3) years during the vibrio control seasons to be determined annually by the State Shellfish Authorities (MA Division of Marine Fisheries and MA Department of Public Health). The variance for this year will begin on May 21, 2015.

Variance for Town of Wellfleet

The Wellfleet Marina parking lot at 255 Commercial Street in Wellfleet may be used as the only location to transfer oysters harvested from any approved site in Wellfleet, provided that the following conditions are met:

- (1) Each transfer of oysters shall occur at the approved transfer site so that unannounced inspections may be conducted by the Wellfleet Shellfish Department, or State Shellfish Authorities,
- (2) Each wholesale seafood dealer truck shall have a valid permit issued by DMF, and
- (3) Each transfer of oysters shall be conducted in accordance with:
 - (a) The Massachusetts Vibrio Control Plan in effect for that season,
 - (b) The NSSP Guide for the Control of Molluscan Shellfish in effect for that season, and
 - (c) The DPH Regulation for Fish and Fishery Products in effect for that season.

Each of the documents that are referenced in section 3(a) will be available on the FPP website at www.mass.gov/dph/fpp during each Vibrio Control season.

This variance will be valid for a period of three (3) years and shall be in effect during the range of dates identified in the Vibrio Control Plan for the years 2015, 2016, and 2017. At any time during this three-year period, this variance may be revoked, modified, or suspended by DPH if the conditions that are referenced above are not met. In accordance with 105 CMR 533.030(C), a copy of this variance will be available to the public.

Chairman Paul Pilcher called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Announcements, Open Session and Public Comment

Pilcher congratulated Judith Stiles about the success of Wellfleet Blossoms. He reminded that Amnesty Day is on Saturday, April 25, 2015 and made the following announcements:

- A Candidates Night sponsored by the Wellfleet Community Forum will be held on Wednesday, April 22 at the COA at 7:00 pm.
- Two informational meetings will be held on Thursday, April 23. The first one will be hosted by the Recycling Committee at 5:00 pm on the proposed plastic bag bylaw; the second one - on Animal Control Officer Bylaw article on dog ordinances will be hosted by the Town Clerk at 7:00 pm at the COA.

Town Administrator Harry Terkanian announced:

- The 2014 Annual Town Report is now available at Town Hall and at the Library.
- The annual beach clean up is scheduled for May 2, 2015 on Mayo Beach. Coffee, donuts and a trash bag will be provided.

Police Chief Ronald Fisetto informed the Selectmen that he has met with the party interested in the rumble strips re-locations on Route 6, and said that he is willing to work with the request, unless the Selectmen decide otherwise and announced:

- WESFest is coming up and volunteers are needed.
- Narcan training will be offered free of charge to the public in the near future.

Dick French of 30 Day Road had concerns about unpaved private roads and snow plowing and gave information about how in the past Day Road used to be plowed until the new snow plowing policy took effect. He asked the Selectmen to consider revisiting the policy and reconsider plowing the road. Pilcher said that this matter will be discussed further in the agenda. Arleen Barnhouse reaffirmed the position of French.

Public Hearing(s)

Hardship – Commercial Shellfish Permit-Late Application: Rafe Emond - *postponed to May 12, 2015*

Licenses

MOTION 215-187: Bruinooge moved and Murphy seconded to approve the Common Victualler License for The Fleetian, Flying Fish Café and Mainstay Motor Inn. The motion passed 5-0.

MOTION 215-188: Bruinooge moved and Houk seconded to approve Weekday Entertainment Licenses for The Fleetian, Flying Fish Café and Mainstay Motor Inn. Discussion ensued between the

Selectmen and Ms. Gail Ferguson regarding her letter about noise issues from the Flying Fish Café. The motion passed 5-0. Bruinooge suggested that Ms. Ferguson talks directly with the owner about the noise amplification. Pilcher explained that amplified noise issues have been extensively discussed inuring several recent meetings and asked why this matter has not been brought up then. Ferguson suggested people to be informed when matters of concerning abutters are discussed.

Appointments

Thomas Siggia's appointment was deferred to May 12 to give opportunity to Mr. Siggia to attend and speak about serving on various boards of interest.

Use of Town Property

Becky Rosenberg, Recreation Director spoke on behalf of International Women's Flag Football Association and presented the details of their request to use Baker Field on September 19 and 20, 2015 for the 10th Annual Kate Clinton Flag Football tournament. Rosenberg explained that the number of participants will be determined as the event approaches. Terkanian recommended requiring proof of liability insurance. Houk wanted to know why the event was moved from Provincetown back to Wellfleet. Murphy wanted to know if any consideration was given to repair the field after the tournament. Terkanian referred to the newly adopted policy of Use of Town Property and suggested that \$100 a day would be appropriate.

MOTION 215-189: Pilcher moved to approve the request of International Women's Flag Football Association to use Baker Field on September 19 and 20, 2015, 9 am - 5 pm for 10th Annual Kate Clinton Flag Football tournament with a fee of \$200, paying for portable potties and providing a proof of liability insurance. Bruinooge seconded the motion. Further discussion ensued. Morrissey suggested asking for \$1,000 security bond. Murphy supported the idea. Bruinooge disagreed with the proposed bond fee and said that this will make it difficult for people to come to Wellfleet. Morrissey did not make a new motion and the original motion passed 5-0.

Ragnar Events to use various town property for charity road race

Terkanian gave a background about the Ragnar's charity road race over the last three years.

MOTION 215-190: Bruinooge moved and Murphy seconded to approve the request of Ragnar Events to use White Crest and Newcomb Hollow Beach parking lots, Lecount Hollow Road, Ocean View Drive and Gross Hill Road for charity road race on Saturday, May 9, 2015 from 4 AM to 5 PM contingent on paying for portable potties, provide proof of liability insurance and paying the processing fee. The motion passed 5-0.

Business

Gull Pond Affordable Housing Project

Ted Malone presented the conversion of Gull Pond Road Affordable Housing project from ownership to rental. He said that the ZBA will support the change pending the review of Town Counsel. He added that the State has not been able to approve any funding for this project. He explained why the acknowledgment of notice of proposed change was needed. Houk wanted to know the rental amounts. Malone went over different rental tiers based on income eligibility. Morrissey wanted to know who the owner of the construction would be and how long the developer has been doing this, and if there were any financial issues. Malone talked about his experience with this kind of projects and affirmed that there are no financial issues. Houk wanted to know if these rental units would be available for purchase if the situation of the tenants would change in the future. Malone explained

that the property will be deed restricted as an affordable housing rental only, and will be owned by a private entity. In these terms a future purchase by a tenant would not be an option.

MOTION 215-191: Pilcher moved to have the Board authorize him to sign and send the two letters¹ as requested and presented in the package. Houk seconded and the motion passed 5-0.

Continuation or termination of no trespass order to David Hawkins

Police Chief Fisette presented the background of the No Trespass order to David Hawkins from last year and asked the Selectmen to reaffirm it for the purpose of docking his boat at the Marina. Pilcher wanted to know the exact details of the order. Fisette gave the specifics.

MOTION 215-192: Bruinooge moved and Murphy seconded to reaffirm the No Trespass order to David Hawkins until more information is provided by the Harbormaster. The motion passed 5-0.

Amendments to Police Department Rules and Regulations

Police Chief Fisette explained the reasons for the Police Department Rules and Regulations². He said that no action was needed by the Selectmen for the proposed new regulations to become effective May 1, 2015. The selectmen did not oppose the proposed changes.

Discussion of policy on plowing paved private roads

Bruinooge presented her concerns about plowing on private roads, based on conversation with and letters and emails by people who live on private roads and do not get plowed by the Town. Bruinooge acknowledged that the past winter has been extraordinary, but agreed that all taxpayers should be considered for plowing and encouraged the Selectmen to further discuss this matter. Murphy wanted to know why the change for plowing private roads was implemented. Paul Lindberg, Assistant DPW Director gave information about the change as a result of 2006 Annual Town Meeting vote. Pilcher referred to the Paved Private Roads policy currently in place and wanted to know how this related to the 2006 ATM vote. Lindberg explained the background of the process. Pilcher clarified that a Town Meeting vote cannot be revoked by the Selectmen. Terkanian said that there is limited record pertaining to the 2006 vote. Pilcher said that this matter should be revisited on May 26, 2015 when more information is available. Helen Miranda Wilson said that the Fire Department has a historical good record of plowing private unplowed roads in case of emergency. Richard Mason of South Wellfleet wanted to know what the response time of emergency in South Wellfleet would be when the road has not been plowed.

Report from the Citizens Economic Development Committee.

David Rheault, Judith Stiles and Manuel Smith were present to speak about the Citizens Economic Development Committee (CEDC) report. Stiles talked about the success of Wellfleet Blossoms. She went over other opportunities provided by the CEDC and how local entrepreneurs are featured. Smith added that the development of new businesses is a priority to the Committee. He said that the Committee is working with the Assistant Town Administrator to establish Wellfleet as a Cultural District by the Massachusetts Cultural Council and the potential benefits to the Town, the merchants and businesses.

Review of Board of Selectmen's goals

Pilcher reviewed the status of the 2015 Board of Selectmen's goals³ and expressed how pleased he is with the progress of the top two goals. He said that periodical review of the goals is important.

Town Administrator's Report

Terkanian went over his report⁴ and said that there are no other additions to the report.

Future Concerns

- Unpaved private roads plowing on May 26, 2015 meeting agenda
- New Vibrio regulations and deer issues on the flats either on May 12 or May 26, 2015 agenda
- Alternative for Route 6 – Main St design project on May 26 agenda or as a separate meeting
