

#### 1.04 Definitions

Small vessel: eliminate “without a motor”

#### 2.05: Small Vessel Storage

(1) To protect fragile coastlines, beach, pond and riparian habitats, and associated vegetation, small vessels (canoes, kayaks, dories, skiffs, dinghies, sail or paddle boards, and similar watercraft) shall be stored in the following manner:

1. On private property, whether residential, commercial or conservation areas, vessels must be stored outside of the 100 foot buffer, unless they are resting on a permitted storage structure, such as a rack, or floating, even at low tide and tied to a permitted dock or mooring, or resting on a preexisting area of open beach or other non-vegetated area above the high tide line.

2. No storage is permitted at Town, State and Federal properties on the shores of bodies of fresh or salt water except at approved locations as designated by the Conservation Commission, in cooperation with the Harbormaster and Beach Administrator, in compliance with the Small Vessel Identification and Permitting program.

#### (2) Small Vessel Identification and Permitting Program

The following locations are approved for small vessel storage:

Indian Neck

Mayo Beach

Pleasant Point

Powers Landing

Private:

Old Wharf Point (Site owned and managed by Wellfleet Conservation Trust)
