

Parking Task Force II AGENDA

Conclusions to date:

- 1) There are several days in the summer when parking demand exceeds available space at most parking areas.
- 2) Ocean-side coastal erosion will continue to eliminate parking spaces
- 3) Data on the size of the problem, by sites, is scarce. Surveys in process.
- 4) The space leased to the Beachcomber has worked well and should be continued for 2019.
- 5) We support, in principle, the Beach Administration proposal to change payment methods at White Cress for daily parking.
- 6) The shuttle service provided by Beachcomber between CH and WC works well.

- 7) The enhanced police controls for drop-off at CH & OVD are effective for safety and traffic control. They should not be relaxed.
- 8) Recommend an informational sign on Route 6 re ocean beach parking availability - frequent, remote updates. (Current Police Department sign is not adequate). - *or consider Town website posting of Ocean beach parking status.*
- 9) Parking scarcity would be helped if a large municipal parking area was available, but there is no feasible, convenient area at present. Such a remote parking area would require shuttles
- 10) Parking regulations need to be enforced, especially at sites other than beaches. Regulations are in the General Bylaws, Marina Regulations and the Zoning Bylaws.
- 11) Parking tickets have a collection rate of 80% of uncontested tickets.
- 12) Beach overflow parking is taking up other parking areas, i.e. Pier, Central District, South Wellfleet and private lots.
- 13) The parking at the pier is being used by far more than just fishermen, boaters and others using it for local needs. Uber and Taxi to Ocean Beaches
- 14) If paid parking is instituted, taxpayers should be exempted in some fashion.
- 15) Bayside and Pond parking are not being studied
- 16) CCNS - No bus drop-offs allowed. Drop-off only by Taxi/Uber
- 17) CCNS Walk-ons and drop-offs charged fee. (Town has been advised not to charge)
- 18) Accurate and timely highway signage of availability has helped the CCNS
- 19) Beach Admin considering moving sticker office to temp Police site on Lawrence Ave in 2020
