## **INTRODUCTION TO KEITH ROSE AND LISA DEXTER'S OPERATIONS ON GRANT #95-25 and 95-26, 2 ACRES, EGG ISLAND**

- Over the past five years, the Shellfish Department has observed hardly any use of sites #95-25 and 95-26 by the grant holders Keith Rose and Lisa Dexter. In 2018, Dexter planted one small clam run. As of May 17, 2022, the same small clam run is there with the same net, which is loose.
- Rose has reported having health issues.
- It is the Shellfish Department's belief that license holders should not keep license sites with merely placeholder operations. As required by our regulations, there must be production and market sales equal to or exceeding \$1,000 an acre. The Rose/ Dexter license site is two acres, and therefore, should demonstrate \$2,000 a year in sales.

## **HISTORICAL OVERVIEW OF GRANT # 95-25 and 95-26**

- License 95-26 granted on Mar. 1, 1996, to Keith Rose.
- License 95-25 granted on May 6, 2004, to Keith Rose.
- Licenses 95-25 and 95-26 were last renewed on Mar. 30, 2014, for ten years to Keith Rose and Lisa Dexter. These licenses expire on Mar. 30, 2024.
- Keith Rose and Lisa Dexter were both issued propagation permits for 2022. Rose had one in 2018 and 2021, but not in 2017 nor 2019. Dexter had one in 2018, 2020 and 2021, but not in 2017 nor 2019.
- According to the annual grant report submitted to the town for 2017, no shellfish were removed or planted on this grant. They estimated that there were 3,000-5,000 pieces of wild stock oysters and 10,000-20,000 quahogs there.
- Shellfish Constable Civetta did a grant inspection on Dec. 7, 2017, with Rose present. Civetta noted that nothing was there and wrote: "We will work together to come up with a plan for productivity moving forward. [We] will meet during the winter before grant reports are due."
- In the spring of 2018, Civetta had a conversation with Dexter about making minimum productivity. She assured me that she was buying clams seed and would be planting it that summer. Civetta happened to be on Egg Island that day and saw Dexter and two helpers plant a short run of clam seed that summer. That was the only activity observed on the license sites that year.
- According to annual grant reports submitted for 2018, 2,000 pieces of mature oyster were removed, and 100,000 pieces of quahog seed were planted. 5,000 pieces of oysters and 100,000 pieces of quahog remained on the license site.
- An annual grant report was not received for this grant in 2019.
- On Oct. 30, 2019, Civetta did a grant inspection with Rose present. Civetta noted they were 'not meeting minimum productivity,' but that he said he "will really work on it next year, and he would come in with his son to meet with us." Civetta also noted that Rose was dealing with some health issues that year.

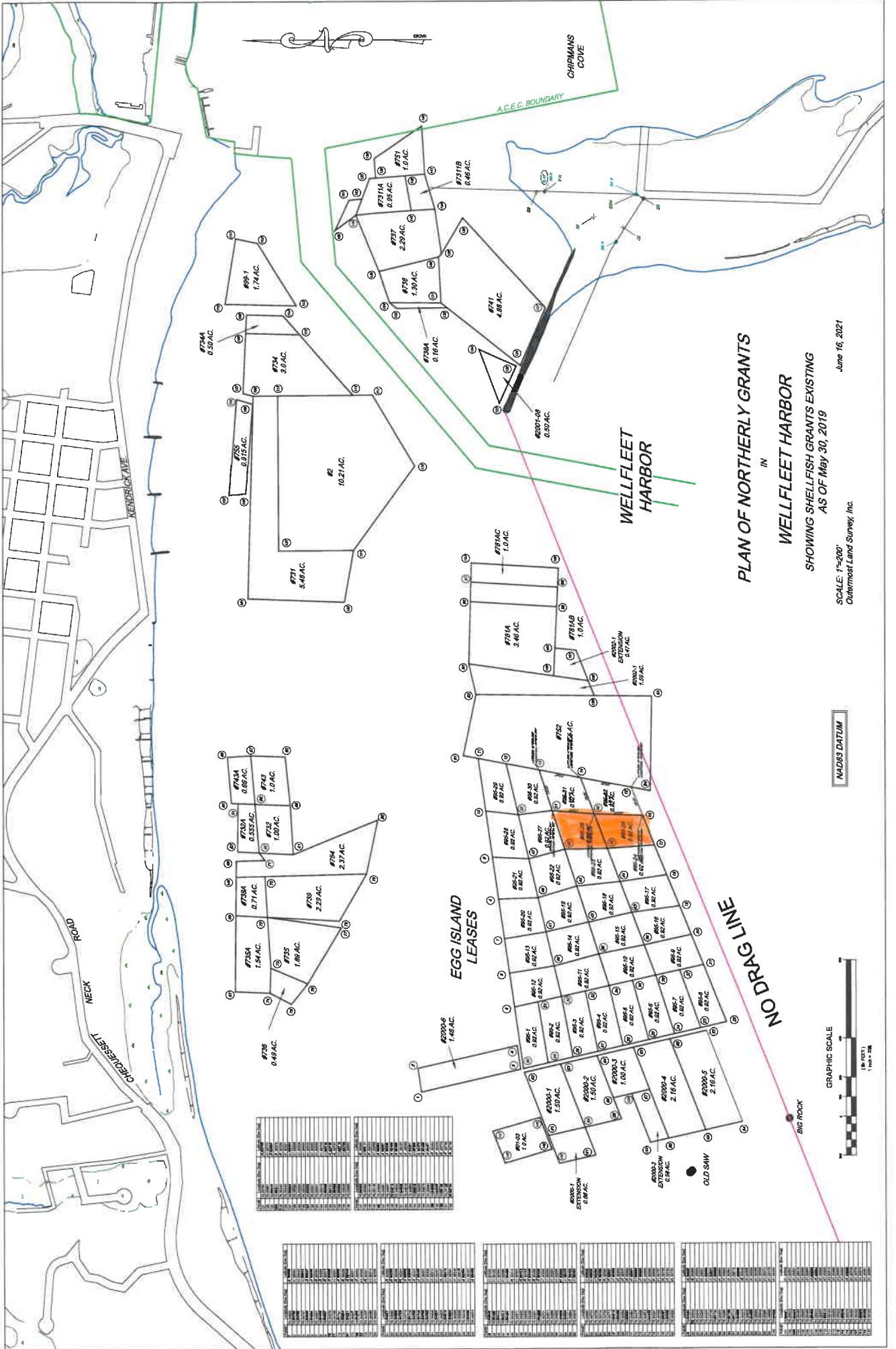

- The annual grant report submitted for 2020 by Lisa Dexter lists the 100,000 quahogs planted in 2018 as still being on the license site. Dexter also noted 5,000-8,000 oysters remaining on the license site. The annual grant report submitted by 2020 by Keith Rose states, “not much was done on the grant in 2020, but “we hope to buy some oyster seed in 2021.”
- Civetta did a grant inspection with Rose’s permission, without him there, on Nov. 12, 2020. She noted that the same 30–50-foot 2018 clam run with net was still there along with wild oysters. She met with Rose on Nov. 19, 2020, and she told him they were not meeting minimum productivity and they needed to actively engage there in the future.
- On Jan. 16, 2020, Dexter was issued a written warning for a violation of Shellfishing Policy and Regulations 7.19.5 Overwintering of Equipment by having loose clam net on the license site past Jan. 15, 2020, and failure to submit an overwintering contract.
- The annual grant report submitted by Rose for 2021 states there was no seed planting, but 20 bushels of mature oysters were removed. However, Rose told Civetta there were no sales in this year. The annual grant report submitted by Lisa Dexter for 2021 states there are 150,000-200,000 pieces of quahog and 5,000 pieces of oyster remaining on the license site. However, no clams have been planted since 2018. Neither annual report states shellfish were planted.
- The most recent grant inspection was performed on Oct. 7, 2021, by Civetta. No grant holders were present. Civetta noted no evidence of minimum productivity and the same short clam run.
- On Jan. 28, 2022, Civetta spoke with Rose on the phone to explain enforcement actions that Shellfish Department was undertaking regarding minimum productivity requirements. Civetta had a phone conversation with Dexter on Jan. 31, 2022, to the same regard.
- On Feb. 4, 2022, Rose and Dexter were sent certified letters that this grant was under review for minimum productivity requirements. In the letter, Civetta requested they petition MA DMF for a record of their sales over the last seven years. The certified mail packet included the documents needed to request sales history through the MA DMF.
- On Feb. 7, 2022, Rose and Dexter both received a follow-up email containing a copy of the letter stating their grant was being monitored for minimum productivity and forms to request sales history from the MA DMF.
- On Feb. 7, 2022, Rose signed for the certified letter. On Feb. 9, 2022, Dexter signed for the certified letter.
- On Mar. 18, 2022, Civetta sent a certified letter to Keith Rose stating that his grant failed to meet minimum productivity requirements along with instructions on how to request a public hearing.
- On Mar. 23, 2022, Civetta delivered the same letter and instructions to Dexter in person, and she signed for its receipt.
- On Mar. 25, 2022, a follow-up email was sent to both with an attachment of the certified letter and instructions for how to request a public hearing.
- On Apr. 1, 2022, Keith Rose signed for the certified letter, dated Mar. 18, 2022.
- On Mar. 28, 2022, Lisa Dexter requested a public hearing.

Dear Keith:

The Shellfish Department has been discussing minimum productivity for your grant #s 95-25 and 95-26 with you since 2017. I spoke with you on the phone on January 28, 2022, and explained the enforcement actions the Shellfish Department was undertaking to this regard and that you would be receiving an email and certified mail with what you needed to do to demonstrate that you have made minimum productivity on these grants. Given that these grants total two acres, you need to sell \$2,000 worth of product annually.

To date, we have not received anything from you with your state SAFIS landings.

Therefore, I am notifying you of failing to meet minimum productivity, which would mean forfeiting your grants. **You have the right to appeal this to the Selectboard within two weeks from this notification.** If you do not file an appeal within that time frame, your license for grant #s 95-26/26 will be forfeited automatically. Here are the Town of Wellfleet's Shellfishing Policy and Regulations to this regard:

7.13.3. Notification of Failure to Meet Minimal Requirements

Subsequent to the filing of the annual report, the Constable will notify any license holder who, in the opinion of the Constable, has failed to meet the minimum requirements. **The license holder has the right to appeal to the Selectboard within two weeks after notification. If no appeal is filed on a timely basis, the license will be forfeited.**

Don't hesitate to call me for further details. Should you want to appeal my determination to the Selectboard, that is your right.

Dear *Kathy*,

As we discussed on the phone, the Shellfish Department has been monitoring your grant for minimum productivity, and we would like to request some additional information from you as we evaluate your grant's production. Here are the regulations:

### 7.12.1. Minimum Levels of Investment and Production

There shall be minimum levels of investment and production required in order to retain an area license. These shall be:

a. During the first, second, and third year after the date of issuance of the license a minimum of \$1000 per acre shall be spent on seed and gear for the area and it shall be evident that this effort of improvement has taken place. Any licensed area that is less than one acre shall be prorated.

b. During the fourth year and every year thereafter there shall be a minimum production of an average of \$1000 worth of product per year per acre, or prorated for a portion thereof, from the practice of aquaculture on the licensed area. This shall be demonstrated by the annual grant report, and, if so requested by the Shellfish Constable, copies of transaction receipts or other acceptable documentation.

In an effort to more fully understand the history of shellfish sales on your farm, the Shellfish Department will be creating a historical review of minimum productivity met on your grant over the last seven years. We chose this time period to take into consideration that the past two years (2020 and 2021) have been affected by market uncertainties during the pandemic caused by COVID-19.

To do this, the Shellfish Department will be cross-referencing your grant reports and our grant inspections paperwork with Mass. Division of Marine Fisheries sales data. We have worked with MADMF, which provided the forms included here to guide you in how to request your data. **When you request your data, please request it from 1/1/2015 to 12-31-2021. You will need to provide your sales information back to the Shellfish Department by February 28, 2022.** MADMF has assured us that they can meet this turn-around time, but please act immediately. If you decide not to query the MADMF, the Shellfish Department will use your grant reports and our grant inspections to make its determination.

Ultimately, the Selectboard is the regulatory authority that decides whether or not a grant must be forfeited. If the Shellfish Department concludes that your grant is not meeting minimum productivity, you will have an opportunity to appeal this determination to the Selectboard and request a public hearing to explain your circumstances.

Attached is the correspondence that has been sent to you from the Town of Wellfleet Shellfish Department regarding noncompliance on grant #s 95-25/26 with the Town's minimum productivity regulations:

**7.12.2. Failure to Meet Production Levels**

Failure of the licensee/s to meet the specified production level for any three (3) consecutive years may result in the forfeit of the aquaculture license and licensed area, as stated in [MGL Chapter 130; Section 65](#).

A certified letter was sent to you on March 21, 2022, with a notice of your failure to meet minimal requirements per our regulations section 7.13.3.

**7.13.3. Notification of Failure to Meet Minimal Requirements**

Subsequent to the filing of the annual report, the Constable will notify any license holder who, in the opinion of the Constable, has failed to meet the minimum requirements. **The license holder has the right to appeal to the Selectboard within two weeks after notification. If no appeal is filed on a timely basis, the license will be forfeited.**

If you would like a public hearing with the Selectboard to explain why you have not met minimum productivity please contact Rebekah Eldridge and request one WITHIN TWO WEEKS of receiving your certified mail. If you do not, you will automatically forfeit your grant. You can certainly request a public hearing at any time before receiving your certified mail, as well.

If the Shellfish Department concludes that your grant is not meeting minimum productivity, you will have an opportunity to appeal this determination to the Selectboard and request a public hearing to explain your circumstances.
