Options/Actions to consider recommending to the Board of Selectmen once 2019 summer data is obtained

- Automated Parking kiosks at the Pier, downtown lots, Main Street, South Wellfleet, and White Crest Beach during peak season
- Satellite parking locations during peak periods
- Shuttle bus service (perhaps using Nauset Regional School electric buses)
- Dedicated parking areas with adequate signage at the Pier for Boat and Slip owners, boat trailers, Fishermen, et al.
- Added parking to make up for the loss of 250 spaces in beach lots.
