

Town Recreational Shellfish Crier July 9, 2022

1. 10-Quart Mixed Shellfish Weekly Limit

The total amount of shellfish, comprising oysters, quahogs, soft-shell clams or razor clams, blood ark clams or ponderous ark clams taken in one (1) week shall not exceed ten (10) quarts, which is one full wire (peck) basket. The new week starts on Sundays. While you may still use a receptacle other than the 10-quart wire basket, we will be bringing the 10-quart basket to the tide and measuring catch. **Anything that does not fit in our baskets will be put back because it means that the catch limit has been exceeded.** Please see the pictures below for the correct size basket. Basket on the right is correct size, a 10-quart basket. Basket on the left is a half bushel basket.



2. The Wellfleet Shellfish Department is Hiring
