







Cape Cod Rail Trail Extension

- Begins at LeCount Hollow Rd and ends near Route 6
- 10-foot wide paved path with
 2-foot shoulders
- ADA Compliant
 - Maximum grades 5%
 - Fully accessible
- New parking lot at terminus













Cape Cod Rail Trail Extension -

Design Coordination with Route 6 Improvements

- Trailhead designed as terminus with:
 - Appropriate Signage
 - Bike racks
 - Bike repair station
 - Crosswalks
 - Safe connection to new Route 6 sidewalk
- Trail to be constructed in phases synced with Route 6 pedestrian and bicycle access












Pavement Preservation Contract

- Wellfleet Town Limits
- Primary Purpose: Pavement Preservation
- Some Sidewalk Construction and restriping to add bike lanes/ buffered bike lanes
- Includes ADA upgrades at:
 - LeCount Hollow Rd
 - Marconi Beach
 - Wellfleet/Eastham town line













Route 6 and Main Street

- Intersection upgrades add:
 - Bicycle and Pedestrian accommodations
 - Left turn lane from Route6 WB into the Pharmacy
- Sidewalk on Main St and Route 6
- Eliminates 2nd Route 6 EB and WB lanes



 Main St












- Phase 3










- Phase 4

 - Construction start anticipated Fall 2023












CCRT Trailhead at Route 6 - Conditions During Construction


- Finalize Route 6 configuration
